In addition to academic grades, the "Learning Skills and Work Habits" section offers valuable insights.

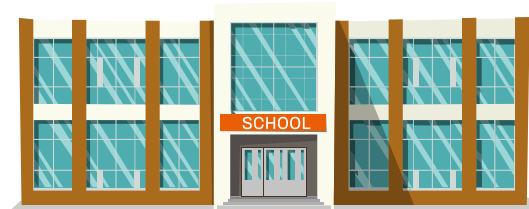
Your child's perspective on learning

Here are some questions to consider when discussing a school's EQAO results:

Do EQAO results show **growth in student learning** over time?

What do Student Questionnaire results reveal about **attitudes toward learning**?

Is the school focusing on **specific academic results or attitudinal patterns**? If so, why?

What is the focus of the school's plan for **student learning and well-being**?
