

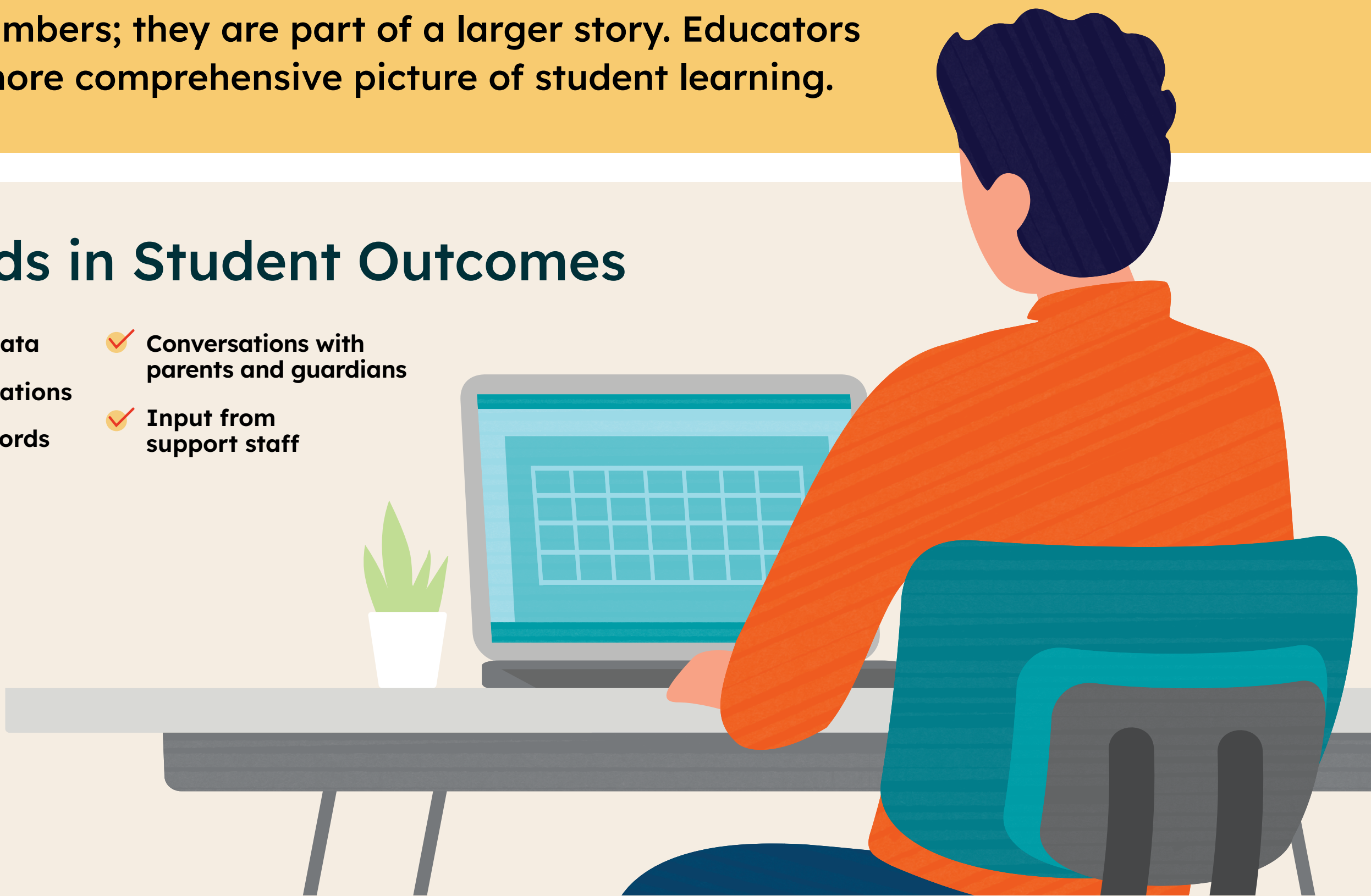
# How Educators Can Use EQAO Data

What sets EQAO data apart is the ability to track student achievement over time and provide a consistent benchmark for educators to view their student results in context with the results of other schools, school boards and the province as a whole.



## EQAO Data

- ▶ are one piece of the overall picture.
- ▶ are comparable year over year and are consistent across the education system.
- ▶ provide independent insight on the achievement of curriculum expectations.
- ▶ support student achievement plans by informing the strategic goals school boards are required to set.
- ▶ help schools identify strengths and areas for improvement to tailor support for their students.

EQAO's achievement, contextual and attitudinal data work alongside your observations of your students' learning path to help you build a robust picture of achievement and learning.

## Using EQAO Data to Inform Decisions



### Achievement Data

Identify trends in student progress.

Highlight areas of strength and improvement (i.e., strands and skills).



### Contextual Data

Leverage the provided background to interpret results.

Consider factors associated with student outcomes.



### Attitudinal Data

Connect student mindset to performance.

Assess student confidence and interest.
